HOW CAN PARENTS SUPPORT THE CONVENTION?

- Take time to ask your child what they have learned recently regarding children's rights
- Discuss the ideas your child is learning in class and try to think of examples from your own experiences, or from the media of rights being respected or denied
- Ask your child's opinion on children's rights.
