Activity	Children look at photographs of their families/when they were babies and use the class camera to take photographs of them now to compare physical similarities and differences in connection with how they have grown.	While learning about the 5 main religions in the UK, and the various celebrations – children use Purple Mash to create themed pictures. E.g. Firework pictures	Children use the interactive whiteboard to play Transport themed Maths games e.g. shape/pattern train Children look at videos and pictures of old and new transport and explore the sounds they make. Children use the interactive whiteboard to practise their letter and number formation using the Letterjoin programme.	Children use the class camera/ipad to take pictures of the beans/caterpillars. These images are viewed on the interactive whiteboard. In the role-play area children have access to a till for the fruit and veg shop.	Children look at photographs of their family pets, and discuss how properly take care of them. Videos are used to explore this further. Children watch videos to listen to the sounds that different animals make. Children use Purple Mash to create animal print pictures. They are encouraged to discuss the different textures and patterns they can see. E.g. scales, fur, stripes, spots. In the role-play area children have access to a till for the pet shop.	Children look at the photographs of them when they were a baby and when they first started Nursery. They discuss how they have changed and grown in that time. Children use ipads/interactive whiteboards to draw detailed self portraits. Children look of photographs of people who help us e.g. firefighters, teachers, police officers etc. They are invited to consider what they would like to do when they grow up. The children look at pictures of the Reception staff and classroom in preparation for Transition to Reception in September.
